Over Queen's Birthday weekend a group from Twizel Area School attended the 30th Annual SGCNZ University of Otago Sheilah Winn Shakespeare Festival in Wellington. Forty-eight schools from across the country performed at the festival over two very hectic and exciting days.



The journey to and from Wellington for the students and staff adds to the overall experience of the festival. Everyone took part in workshops run by professional directors and actors on the Friday. We were

also fortunate to be able to tour Toi Whakaari (NZ Drama School) and we also attended Circa's delightful production of *The Mourning After*.

Our excerpt from *The Tempest* was performed on Sunday morning and was enjoyed by the audience of over 500 people in the Michael Fowler Theatre, Wellington. The feedback from members of the audience was very positive. The students also watched the other 47 performances of Shakespeare's plays. These ranged from the hilariously funny to the highly tragic.
