From our Principal

Kia ora e te whānau, and welcome to Term 3!

I'd like to pass on my congratulations to the inspirational students representing the South of the South at the National Area Schools Tournament, and my thanks to the staff accompanying them in Dunedin during their 'holiday' time.

them.

During the term break, I was approached by the DHB regarding COVID-19 vaccinations. It is their intention to provide an opt-in vaccination programme on the school site in the near future for all unvaccinated students aged 16 and above, as well as staff. Their intended timeframe is Term 3. At present, the vaccination is not licensed for students under 16 in New Zealand. Further information including dates will be distributed once we know more from the DHB.

Also during the term break, a concern has been raised regarding locker security. In response to that concern, the school has purchased a number of combination locks for hire through the main office. If you'd like to hire a combination lock for your child's locker, the hire rate is \$15 which is fully refundable on return of the lock (in good working order) at the end of the school year. This allows us to purchase a new lock if the unit is lost or damaged. We do ask that the school locks are used so that we can manage the combination codes just in case they are forgotten, or the lock needs to be removed in an emergency (as per School Security policy).

On Monday, the staff and board from Twizel Area School along with representative staff members from Mackenzie College and Aoraki Mt. Cook Primary welcomed Kirsty Farrant from PPTA as a guest speaker. She updated us on the National Educational Learning Priorities (NELPs) which were brought into law at the end of last year. She spoke specifically on Objective 1: Learners at the Centre, with a focus on the third descriptor. This descriptor states that we must 'Create a safe and inclusive culture where diversity is valued and all learners/ākonga and staff, including those who identify as LGBTQIA+, are disabled, have learning support needs, are neurodiverse, or from diverse ethnic communities, feel they belong'. Thank you to Kirsty for delivering this informative session, it has certainly allowed us to continue our conversation around our obligations within the NELPs.


