From the Principal

Kia ora e te whanau!

Last week we had the pleasure of hosting the parents of the prospective new entrant students for the remainder of 2021. Some of them are new to the school, others old hands! The afternoon was structured around three sections, an informal question and answer session, a tour of the entire school and time in the new entrant classroom finding out about the programme of learning. Thank you to Miss Douglas and Mrs Potter for organising the afternoon. I'd like to take this opportunity to welcome two new permanent staff members to our school - Melissa McLellan is confirmed as the permanent teacher of Room 13, and Alison Blanchard joins our team as Specialist Teacher with Bridget Newlands confirming her last day in the role as August 18th. We're sad to see Bridget go as she offers so much to the school and our learners, however, we do understand that now is the time she would like to concentrate on her family business. I'm sure everyone will join me in warmly welcoming Melissa and Alison to our team.

This week, a number of our staff have been travelling to Roxburgh to engage with professional learning through our Kāhui Ako (Community of Learning).

- On Monday, the within and across school teachers met to discuss their leadership of local curriculum development, our most recent project being the refinement of our enrolment and exit process. You can see our <u>quiding document here</u>. We hope to integrate our new system in coming weeks.
- On Tuesday, Chris Longbottom, Melissa McLellan and Sandy Nelson attended a Culturally Responsive Practice Workshop led by a Core Education representative. They will continue to meet to develop and



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spread their practice throughout the year.

 On Wednesday, Kay and Neil Potter attended the Deputy and Assistant Principal Workshop.

The Kāhui Ako as a group of Area Schools includes Twizel, Roxburgh, Lawrence and Maniototo. We work together on a common goal to integrate our <u>local curricula</u>.

In Term 4, we're hoping to run a two day Outdoor First Aid Course for staff who wish to upskill in readiness for Outdoor Education and Camps. The course will be run by Peak Safety Training. We have a number of places available for adult members of the community if anyone is interested in joining us. The cost will be \$250 per person, plus an additional \$25 if you wish to be accredited with an NZQA accredited qualification at the end of the course. We are yet to confirm dates. If you would like to join us, please let the office know.

Lastly, don't forget we have a Ministry of Education required teacher only day on Friday 13th August. This is part of the NCEA Accord agreement for staff professional learning time.




Digital Technology
